People relocate to the Hurricane area for a variety of reasons. Whatever the reason or combination of reasons, this is a great area in which to live and work. Utah's Dixie is packed with exciting things to see and do. Many events and activities are just minutes away such as: golfing, fishing, hiking trails, festivals, cultural events, symphony and celebrity concert series, O.C. Tanner Amphitheater in Springdale, Tuacahn performances in Ivins, Washington County Fair, Ironman, Peach Days, Huntsman Senior Games, St. George Marathon and so much more.

Hurricane was established in 1905 after pioneers, spending eleven years building a canal to water the two thousand acres of fertile land, finished this historic task without modern tools and equipment. This land produces many fruits, vegetables, and nuts, and is known as Southern Utah's "Fruit Basket."

The City of Hurricane received its name from an 1865 incident in which a sudden gust of wind blew the top off of Erastus Snow's buggy. He exclaimed, "My, that was a Hurricane!" The world-famous Hurricane Fault was named as a result of this event, and later when the town was organized, the unanimous decision was to name it "Hurricane."

GRAND CANYON NAT'L PARK - 130 miles east of Hurricane was the setting for the movie, "Butch Cassidy & The Sundance Kid." Homes, school & cemetery still stand as a reminder of pioneer courage against a wild raging river.

Grand Canyon Nat'l Park, 130 miles to the southeast offers a remarkable experience. The rugged walls of deep red & orange hues are beautifully contrasted by evergreens, making it one of the "Seven Wonders of the World."

Jacob Hamblin Home - Early Mormon Pioneer Jacob Hamblin was a missionary friend of the Indians, who trusted & protected this good man. Jacob built this home for his wives & numerous children.

Kolob Fingers - Turn off I-15 some 20 miles North of Hurricane & a five mile fascinating drive leads to narrow box canyons that jut out, looking similar to fingers. These "red hills of Utah" may well cause you to gasp in awe & wonderment.

Kolob Reservoir - A pleasant 35 mile drive east of Hurricane brings you among the tall evergreen trees of Kolob. A refreshing cool place to be in the heat of summer, & a snowmobiling & tubing treat in winter. Good fishing at the reservoir, too.

Lake Powell located on Hwy. 89, 60 miles east of Kanab, has 1900 miles of crystal blue waters offering fishing, waterskiing, sailing, scuba diving or just plain boating. The never ending canyons offer a never ending surprise.

Mountain Meadows - 49 miles northwest of Hurricane is the long narrow valley of Mountain Meadows, where in 1858 the massacre of a wagon train took place. A monument has been erected as a reminder of this grim tragedy.

SOUTHERN UTAH.
Pine Valley is located 53 miles northwest of Hurricane & is a beautiful mountain valley of tall ever-green trees and a cool refreshing place from the summer heat.

Pipe Springs Nat'l Monument - 42 miles southeast of Hurricane. The Mormon Fort gets its name from the natural springs found there. It provided protection from the local Piute Indians for the early pioneers & is truly an oasis in the desert.

Quail Lake at the western edge of Hurricane offers four square miles of boating, sailing, swimming, jet skiing, or just plain fishing & picnicking. This reservoir stores precious water for the thirsty lands around it.

Red Cliffs Rec. area is located just off I-15 some 14 miles northwest of Hurricane. This favorite picnic spot offers desert, spring water & trees for a pleasant summer outing.

St. George Mormon Temple, the first temple built in the west, was completed in 1868. It's magnificent white beauty can be seen for miles around. The visitors center welcomes all to come in, look around & enjoy several movies about life, love & happiness.

Silver Reef Ghost Town, located approx. 16 miles north & west of Hurricane offers two banks, including the Wells Fargo Bank, three stores, homes & footings of a mill & three cemeteries.

Snow Canyon State Park, located 30 miles west of Hurricane is approx. 3 miles long & offers majestic canyon walls of red sandstone, black lava formations & sand dunes, as well as backpacking trails for a true adventurer.

Zion Nat'l Park - Just 25 miles east of Hurricane, this magnificent canyon is made up of massive sandstone cliffs & formations that soar over lush valleys accented by waterfalls & rivers. Picnicking & hiking are a must.

miles west of Hurricane in St. George was Pres. Young's winter retreat, where he could watch & supervise the construction of his beloved Temple. This home offers the visitor a splendid view of pioneer era home life.

Brian Head is located 75 miles northeast of Hurricane & offers some of the best skiing, snowmobiling & cross country skiing in the state. Avoid the long lines of northern Utah & try southern Utah's winter wonderland.

Bryce Canyon Nat'l Park lies 110 miles northeast of Hurricane. A fascinating display of multi colored free-standing spires & towers which actually change color as the sun's reflection bounces off the shimmering rocks.

Cedar Breaks Nat'l Monument, 58 miles to the north & east offers colorful cliffs, spires & forests of aspens & evergreens that can all easily be seen from your car.

Coral Pink Sand Dunes is located 56 miles east of Hurricane through Zion Nat'l Park. It offers a chance to play in nature's sandbox or capture the unique color of the sand on film. The turnoff is 3 miles from Mt. Carmel Jct. & 11 miles from the main road.

Fort Pierce-Dinosaur Tracks, approx. 17 miles south of Hurricane, mostly on dirt graded roads, is one of three local areas where dinosaur tracks can be seen in the sandstone of the desert.
